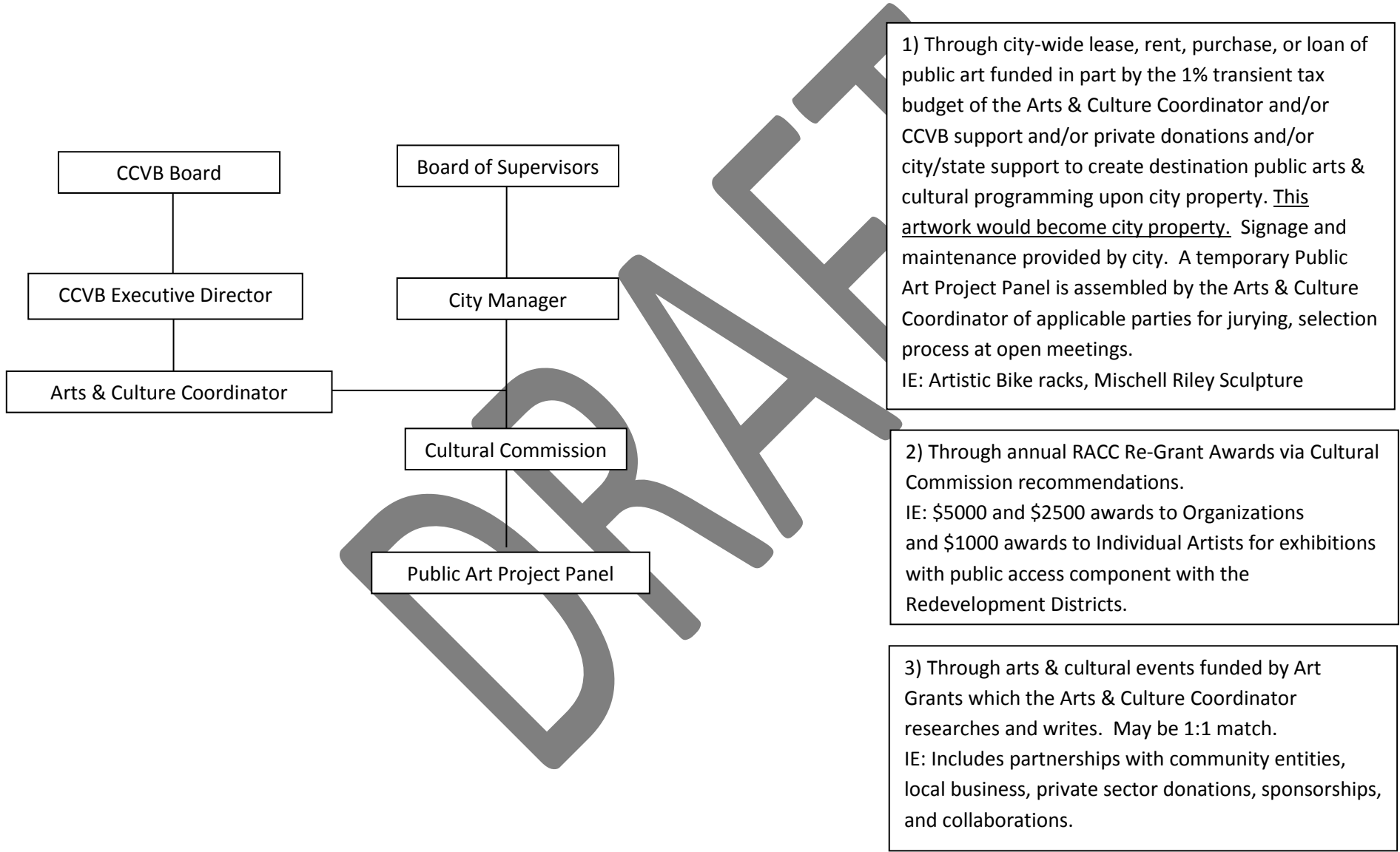


CARSON CITY ARTS & CULTURE ORGANIZATIONAL & FUNDING CHART

DRAFT



1) Through city-wide lease, rent, purchase, or loan of public art funded in part by the 1% transient tax budget of the Arts & Culture Coordinator and/or CCVB support and/or private donations and/or city/state support to create destination public arts & cultural programming upon city property. This artwork would become city property. Signage and maintenance provided by city. A temporary Public Art Project Panel is assembled by the Arts & Culture Coordinator of applicable parties for jurying, selection process at open meetings.  
IE: Artistic Bike racks, Mischell Riley Sculpture

2) Through annual RACC Re-Grant Awards via Cultural Commission recommendations.  
IE: \$5000 and \$2500 awards to Organizations and \$1000 awards to Individual Artists for exhibitions with public access component with the Redevelopment Districts.

3) Through arts & cultural events funded by Art Grants which the Arts & Culture Coordinator researches and writes. May be 1:1 match.  
IE: Includes partnerships with community entities, local business, private sector donations, sponsorships, and collaborations.

4) Through smaller local arts & cultural events funded by 1% transient tax budget of the Arts & Culture Coordinator to create community infrastructure and collaboration.

IE: Fashion Films in February, Casino Cancelled Cards Competition

5) Through public art proposals developed by private/municipal parties where public art funding is secured. A Public Art Proposal Form is submitted to the Arts & Culture Coordinator for the determination of assembling a temporary Public Art Project Panel of applicable parties for jurying, selection process at opening meetings if applicable.

IE PRIVATE: Downtown Business Association/ Eric Burke Mural, John Rutledge/Mauricio Sandoval Mural

IE MUNICIPAL: Possible future policy for a Carson City 'Percent for Art' in capital projects requiring that 1 or 2% of the budget for eligible City-funded construction projects is spent on artwork for City facilities.

The Percent for Art program offers City agencies the opportunity to acquire or commission works of art specifically for City-owned buildings throughout the city. The purpose of the program is to bring artists into the design process and enrich the City's civic and community buildings.
