NEVADA STATE MUSEUM

Take a walk through time at the Nevada State Museum in Carson City. Your first step brings you into the former Carson City Mint building where coins were minted from 1870 to 1893 – 57 issues of silver, all bearing the distinguishing “CC” mint mark. On display is the formidable Coin Press No. 1 and a complete set of Carson City Morgan dollars. Other exhibits include Explore Under One Sky, a Native American exhibit from their perspective and in their own words and Nevada’s Changing Earth, displaying over 300 examples of rocks and minerals from Nevada and the western United States.

STEWART INDIAN SCHOOL CULTURAL CENTER & MUSEUM

The mission of the Stewart Indian School Cultural Center and Museum is to tell the stories of the thousands of American Indian children from western tribes who were educated at Stewart. These stories tell of a complex past that changed the course of generations of these children. The countless stories of hardship, resilience, strength, and triumph are at the core of the current efforts to preserve the Stewart campus and are illustrated in the exhibits at the museum. In addition to sharing Stewart's history, the museum is a place of living heritage through exhibits of contemporary Native art, storytelling, arts and crafts demonstrations, lectures, public programming, and educational activities. The museum serves as a research facility for Stewart students, staff, faculty, alumni, and the general public. This museum is not a museum in the Western sense, but a gathering place for Stewart alumni and their families.

STATE CAPITOL TOUR

Take a tour of the State Capitol Building of Nevada! Learn about the history of Nevada, and the founders of Carson City. Explore the unique history through the new revitalized Battle Born Hall Exhibit (2018). Capitol Building, constructed of native sandstone, holds the special designation of second oldest capitol building west of the Mississippi River.

CARSON CANYON RAILBIKE TOURS

Pedal your way through history aboard a Freedom Rail railbike along the historic Virginia & Truckee train route. Your journey takes you into beautiful Carson River Canyon along an exciting, curved, and gradual 2% grade track system to the historic Eureka Mill rest area. Our motor-assisted, pedal railbikes provide a comfortable trip out of the canyon, across the V&T Railway highway bridge to an additional historic site, the Halfway House Stage Stop. Here you will enjoy a water and a complimentary snack. This one-of-a-kind tour is 60 – 70 minutes and is for all ages over 4. Passengers must be able to pedal for an extended time period.



V&T RAILWAY TRAIN EXPERIENCE

Rediscover Nevada's rich history in mining and mills on the V&T Railway Carson City-Virginia City route as you meander through tunnels, canyons and mining towns aboard a restored 1914 Pullman coach led by a 1916 Baldwin 2-8-0 steam locomotive. This relaxing, all-day train excursion is fully narrated with historical facts and anecdotes. Departing from Carson City's Eastgate Depot, the 24-mile round-trip tour includes a fun 3.5-hour stopover in historic Virginia City, where you can stroll the boardwalks and explore restaurants, shops, saloons, museums, mines and more. KIT-CARSON TRAIL TOUR

The Kit Carson Trail is a path through Carson City's historic west side. It features stops at landmarks including 1800s-era Victorian-style homes, museums and churches. More than 45 landmarks telling the story of the capital city's history are featured along the Kit Carson Trail. Highlights include the Governor's Mansion, Krebs-Peterson Home where they filmed John Wayne's last film, the Shootist, the Clemens House, where Samuel Clemens (Mark Twain) and his brother, Orion Clemens lived, and the Ferris House, the inventor of the Ferris Wheel, and his Father, George Washington Gale Ferris, who planted numerous varieties of trees at the State Capitol Grounds.

NEVADA STATE RAILROAD MUSEUM

The Nevada State Railroad Museum preserves the railroad heritage of Nevada, including locomotives and cars of the famous Virginia & Truckee Railroad and other railroads of the Silver State. Many were bought from Hollywood studios, where they were made famous in movies and television shows. Among 65 locomotives and cars in the collection, 40 were built before 1900, and 31 pieces that operated on the V & T Railroad. Museum activities consist of operation of historic railroad equipment, including train rides, handcar rides, lectures, an annual railroad history symposium, changing exhibits, and a variety of special events. The Museum also has an ongoing research and restoration program.
